We invite you to participate in the International Scientific and Practical Conference on the topic: "Chemistry of Complex Compounds, Chemistry, Analytics and Technologies of Noble and Rare Metals: Current Problems and Prospects".

The conference will be held on October 22–23, 2026, at the National University of Uzbekistan named after Mirzo Ulugbek, pursuant to the Order of the Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Innovation No. 11 dated January 16, 2026.

The goal of the conference is to discuss the results of current scientific research in the fields of chemistry of complex compounds, chemistry of noble and rare metals, their analysis and technologies, ecological issues, and related scientific areas; to exchange experience, attract talented young scientists to promising research fields, and highlight the integration of science and innovation in the Republic of Uzbekistan.

Main focus areas of the conference:

- ✓ Fundamental problems of the chemistry of complex compounds: structure, properties, and reactivity;
- ✓ Physicochemical methods for the analysis and characterization of complex compounds;
- ✓ Metal complexes in applied technologies and materials;
- ✓ Chemistry and analysis of noble and rare metal compounds;
- ✓ Ecological aspects of the application and processing technologies of noble and rare metals: green methods and resource conservation;
- ✓ Ecological chemistry and environmental protection:

Official languages of the conference: Uzbek, English, and Russian.

Deadline for abstract submission: September 30, 2026.

Abstract formatting requirements:

1. Page count per abstract: 1-3 pages.
2. Text format: MS Word – 2003/2007. Page size: A4 (210x297 mm).
Margins: 2.5 cm on all sides. The text must be typed only in Times New Roman font, 14 points, with 1.15 line spacing.
3. The abstract should be formatted in the following order (Appendix 1):

- the title of the abstract, written in capital letters (14-point font size), should be centered on the page;
- full name(s) of the author(s) (14-point font);
- name of the organization, city, country (12-point font);
- main text of the abstract (14-point font);
- figure and table titles must be numbered with Arabic numerals (Fig. 1, Table 1, etc.), and they must be referenced within the text of the abstract; the font size inside tables must be no less than 12 points;
- used bibliographic sources are listed at the end of the article as a numbered list under the heading "References" (12-point font); the numbering must be in alphabetical order; in-text bibliographic citations must be enclosed in square brackets only (e.g., [1]);

4. The deadline for conference registration and paper submission is September 30, 2026.

The filename must indicate the surname of the first author.
